ORDERS BY THE GOVERNOR
NOTIFICATION

Dated Dispur, the 10th November, 2014.

No. JDJ(E) 265/2009/81 : Whereas the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its Judgment dated 31.3.2014 passed in WPC No. 521/2002 has, after taking into consideration Schemes formulated by the Government of Andhra Pradesh and other States extending various post-retiral benefits to the retired Chief Justice and retired Judges of their respective High Courts, expressed its hope and trust that the States who have not so far framed such scheme will formulate the same, depending on the local conditions, for the benefit of the retired Chief Justices and retired Judges of the respective High Courts as early as possible preferably within a period of six(6) months from the date of receipt of copy of this order, and

Whereas in pursuance of Resolution No. 18 adopted in the conference of Chief Ministers and Chief Justices of the High Courts held on 18-09-2004 to the effect that as regards post-retiral benefits to the retired Judges of the High Courts, the Scheme sanctioned by the State of Andhra Pradesh be adopted and followed in all the States except where better benefits are already available, most of the State have extended such benefits in their respective States, and

Whereas after taking into consideration the above aspects as well as the Scheme formulated by the Government of Andhra Pradesh, the Cabinet in its Meeting held on 02-11-2014 have approved formulation of similar Scheme in the State of Assam,

The Governor of Assam is, therefore, pleased to allow the following benefits in respect of retired Chief Justices and retired Judges of the Gauhati High Court:-

1. Sanction of an amount of Rs.14,000/- (Rupees fourteen thousand) only, per month to the retired Chief Justices of the Gauhati High Court and an amount of Rs.12,000/- (Rupees twelve thousand) only per month, to the retired Judges of the Gauhati High Court, for defraying the services of an orderly; driver, security guard etc., and for meeting the expenses incurred towards secretarial assistance on contract basis, and
2. A residential telephone free of cost with number of free calls to the extent of 1500/-per month, over and above the free calls per month, allowed by the telephone authorities, to both retired Chief Justices and retired Judges of the High Courts.

The above benefits are subject to the condition that these benefits will be admissible to the retired Chief Justices and retired Judges of the Gauhati High Court who are getting pension from the Govt. of Assam and will not be applicable if the retired Chief Justices/retired Judges get identical benefits in any post-retiral assignment.

The Registrar General/DDO, Gauhati High Court (Principal Seat) shall draw and disburse the above sanctioned amount.


